<b>Page No. (at bottom of Opinion)</b>	<b>Quick Description of the District Court's Reference to Mr. Moscaret on Page(s)</b>
<b>4</b>	Mr. Moscaret is identified by the District Court as one of Lead Plaintiff's Counsel's "nationally prominent experts on fee awards" who is testifying in the case.
<b>90</b>	The District Court finds that Mr. Moscaret, as a fee expert, "is highly qualified to testify about attorneys' fees and market rates."
<b>91, 92, 93, 115 (including footnotes)</b>	The District Court agrees with and adopts Mr. Moscaret's expert opinions about the reasonableness of Lead Plaintiff's Counsel's hourly rates in the case.
<b>95, 98, 102, 103</b>	The District Court agrees with and adopts Mr. Moscaret's expert opinions about the reasonableness of Lead Plaintiff's Counsel's use of local contract attorneys in the case, and the hourly rates charged for them.
<b>103, 108, 167, 168, 169</b>	The District Court agrees with and adopts Mr. Moscaret's expert opinions about the reasonableness of Lead Plaintiff's Counsel's case staffing and efficient litigation management practices in the case.
<b>167</b>	The District Court finds Mr. Moscaret to be a "recognized fee expert" who was able to review Lead Plaintiff's Counsel's fee request in detail.
<b>182, 183</b>	The District Court agrees with and adopts Mr. Moscaret's expert opinions that the so-called <i>Laffey Matrix</i> is not suitable for determining reasonable hourly rates in large, complex litigation involving big law firms, such as this case.
